How can I possibly face the Lord in my condition, is what he says.







- some public policy advocates have attempted to intimidate persons with religious-based points of view from influencing or making laws in our democracy. Some of these characterize the free exercise of religion as protecting no more than the privilege of worshipping in the protected space of homes, churches, synagogues, or mosques. ...
