Joseph Smith discovered bank president had embezzled \$25,000.

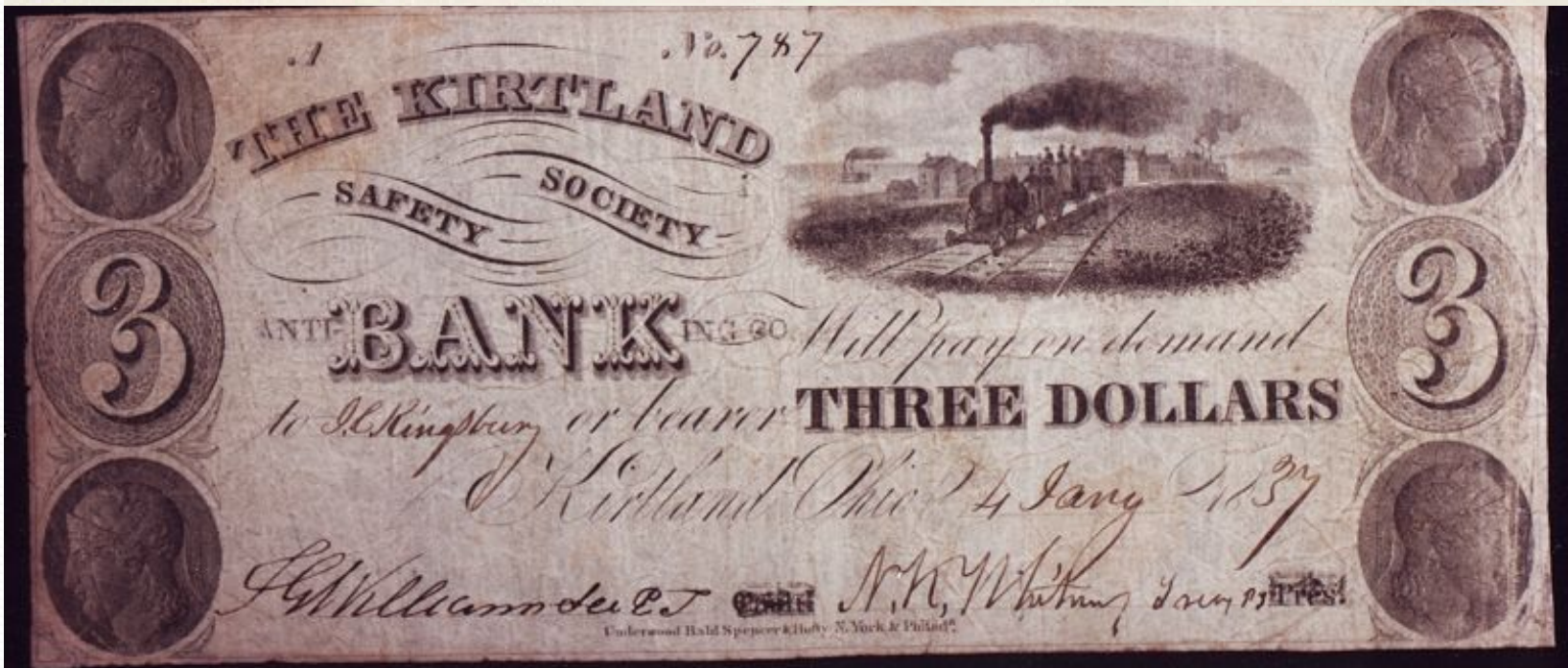
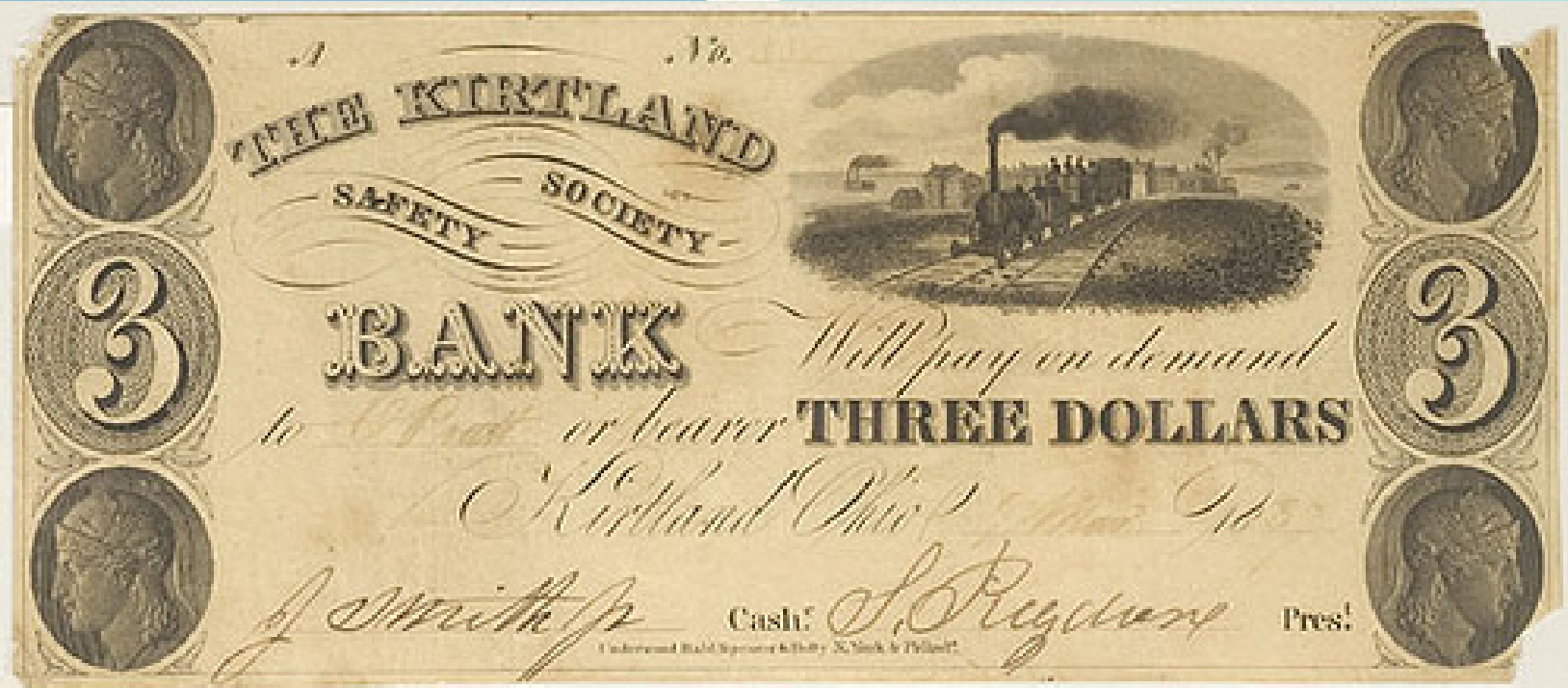
Bank fails in November, 1837

Flees Kirtland for Missouri due to mobs

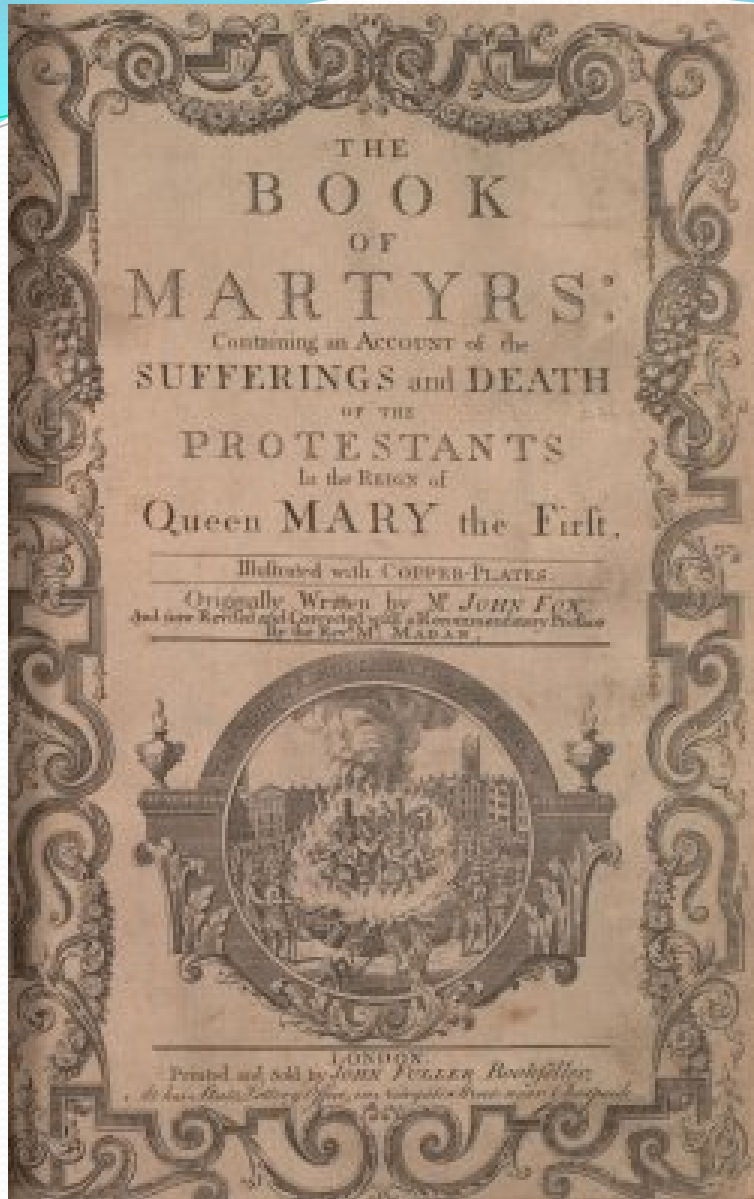
