2	FROGS Exodus 8:1-15	Hapi     Heqt     Frog goddess to Egypt.     Both related to fertility	<ul> <li>Duplicated by the Egyptians</li> <li>Occurs in Goshen where Israelites lived.</li> </ul>
3	LICE Exodus 8:16-19	Seb The earth god of Egypt	<ul> <li>Not duplicated by the Egyptians</li> <li>Occurs in Goshen where Israelites lived.</li> <li>Attributed to the "finger of God."</li> </ul>
4	FLIES Exodus 8:20-32	Uatchit - The fly god of Egypt.	<ul> <li>God now makes a separation between the Egyptians and the Israelites.</li> <li>No more plagues will come upon the Israelites.</li> </ul>
5	DISEASE ON CATTLE Exodus 9:1-7	Ptah      • Mnevis     Hathor     • Amon     Bulls and cows.	Affects property.     Death of livestock.
6	BOILS Exodus 9:8-12	<ul> <li>Sekhmet - Egyptian goddess of Epidemics</li> <li>Serapis</li> <li>Imhotep</li> <li>Egyptian gods of healing.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Affects physical bodies.</li> <li>Pharaoh's magicians cannot even appear in court.</li> </ul>
7	HAIL Exodus 9:13-35	<ul> <li>Nut - Egyptian sky goddess.</li> <li>Isis &amp; Seth - Egyptian agriculture deities.</li> <li>Shu - Egyptian god of the atmosphere.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Historical uniqueness for such a storm in Egypt.</li> <li>Pharaoh confesses his sin but later changes his mind.</li> </ul>
8	LOCUSTS Exodus 10:1-20	<ul> <li>Serapia - Egyptian deity protector from Locusts</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Pharaoh offers a compromise.</li> <li>The compromise is rejected.</li> <li>Pharaoh again confesses his sin.</li> </ul>
9	DARKNESS Exodus 10:21-29	<ul> <li>Re • Amon-re • Aten • Atum • Horus</li> <li>Thoth - Egyptian moon god.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Dark in Egypt at midday.</li> <li>Apparently light was still provided for the Israelites in Goshen.</li> </ul>
10	DEATH OF FIRSTBORN Exodus 12:29-36	This plague was a judgment on all of Egypt's gods, including Pharaoh himself. In Exodus 1, Pharaoh had killed the sons of Israel. Now the Lord kills the firstborn sons of the Egyptians (Exodus 11-12). Pharaoh will now let Israel go. He will later loose his army to death in the Red Sea (Exodus 14:4-31).

## ELDER HOLLAND

Like Moses in that vision, there may come after the fact some competing doubts and confusion, but it will pale when you measure it against the real thing.

- <u>Remember the real thing.</u> Remember how urgently you have needed help in earlier times and you got it.
- The Red Sea will open to the honest seeker of revelation. The adversary has power to hedge up the way, to marshal Pharaoh's forces and dog our escape right to the water's edge, but he can't produce the real thing. He cannot conquer if we will it otherwise.
- Exerting all our powers, the light will again come, the darkness will again retreat, the safety will be sure. That is lesson number one about crossing the Red Sea by the spirit of revelation.

#### ELDER HOLLAND- 2<sup>ND</sup> LESSON

- That is the second lesson of the spirit of revelation. After you have gotten the message, after you have paid the price to feel His love and hear the word of the Lord, go forward.
- Don't fear, don't vacillate, don't quibble, don't whine. You may, like Alma going to Ammonihah, have to find a route that leads an unusual way, but that is exactly what the Lord is doing here for the children of Israel.
- Nobody had ever crossed the Red Sea this way, but so what? There's always a first time. With the spirit of revelation, dismiss your fears and wade in with both feet.
- In the words of Joseph Smith, "Brethren [and sisters], shall we not go on in so great a cause? Go forward and not backward. Courage, brethren; and on, on to the victory!" 12
